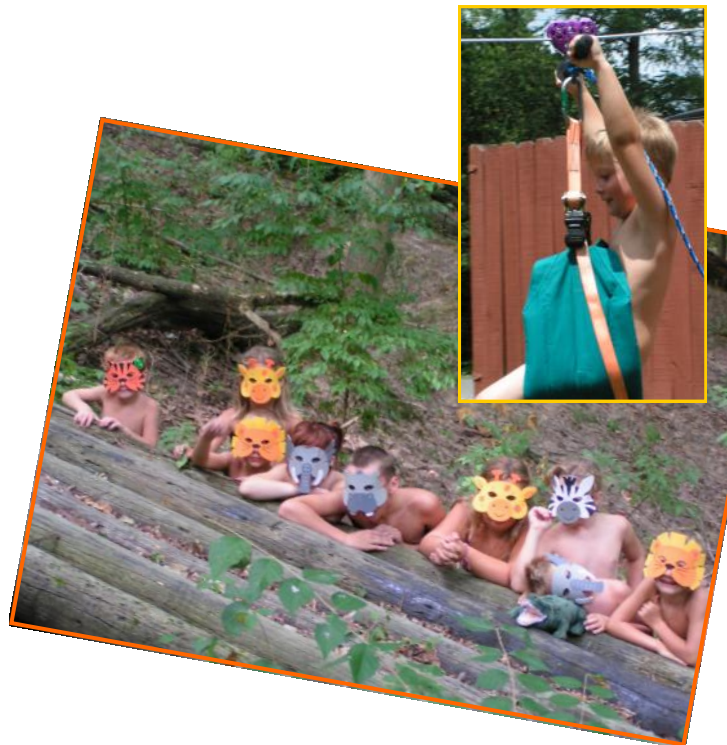

## Our 5 Day Curriculum (note: subject to some variations)

This year we focus on **SURVIVAL!**

### Daily Challenges and Survival Skills

There will be learning opportunities like, shelter building, safe fire building, reading a compass, following a map, making sundials to read the time of day, water challenges in the pool, scavenger hunt, tying knots in ropes, using mud to protect their skin from bugs and sun.

### Daily Ceremony

Our daily ceremony will be loosely based on the reality TV Survivor but instead of voting someone off, voting will be for the most useful, most woodsy, most hard working etc. At the end of the week there will be a vote for the survivor that someone would most like to be lost with.

Throughout the week we will relate stories of famous survivors or adventurers like the Mary Ingalls or Daniel Boone. We will incorporate science discussions in every aspect of building their skill set. Examples: Why does focusing on the sun start a fire? Why is untreated water unsafe to drink (using microscope to show creatures in the water?) Why does the compass point North.? We will include art in the form of body painting, painting banners for their survivor camp, using knot tying skills to macramé something useful, map making and creative SOS signals.

Parents are encouraged to attend the final ceremony on Friday evening - a cookout and recap of what the kids experienced all week.

Every day kids take turns raising and lowering flags. They fold the flags and recite the pledge of allegiance. We also teach flag etiquette.

As usual, Friday is games day - playing outdoor games, swimming, zip-line etc. We will try to put a survivor twist on the games.



We encourage parents to attend the Friday night cook out where the kids will recap their experiences of the week. We may have fun impromptu things to do in the evening.

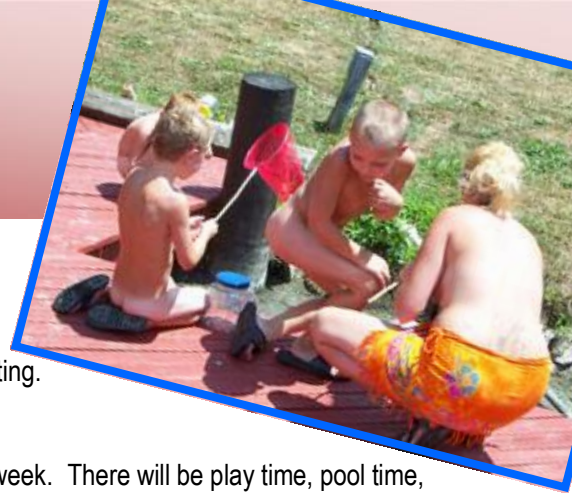

# PG KiDS KAMP 2015 FAQs



## **What is the theme for the camp?**

Our camp encompasses educational themes in various fields of Science and Nature Arts and Cultures. Each topic will have a new theme to keep learning interesting and exciting.

## **Is there a schedule for the day?**

Each day, kids will spend time researching or experimenting in relation to the topic of the week. There will be play time, pool time, discussion time and scheduled lunch and snacks. At the end of the day, kids will have an opportunity to present to parents or grandparents what they have learned during that day's curriculum.

## **What kind of permission paperwork do I need to enroll my child?**

We follow the general Resort outline of requiring a letter of permission on file from both parents – even if the parents are divorced or in the case of grandparents. If a parent has sole custody, we will need a letter stating that status.

## **What is the adult supervision?**

There will be both a male and female adult supervision with a number of 10-12 participants. Projects and discussions will be altered to fit the age. Older children will be partnered with younger ones.

## **Is the subject of nudism discussed?**

This is one time when we feel the subject of nudism can be discussed safely. Sometime during the week our day will allow us to engage the kids in this topic. They can sit with their peers and talk about what nudism means to them. Short discussions of 10 to 15 minutes could include the topics such as Health and Safety or Proper Etiquette. In addition, we want the kids to feel part of a larger community (PG resort) by completing a small resort project.

## **What will the kids need to bring to KiDS KAMP?**

Other than helping your child look forward to the week, it is important to prepare a "personal backpack". We suggest two towels each day, sunscreen, old closed toed shoes for hiking, flip flops and or any type of personal item your child might need. In the unlikely event of an emergency, include a pair of shorts and shirt. Please mark items with your child's name. They also need to bring a lunch.

## **Are there evening activities?**

**KiDS KAMP** ends at 5:00pm. However, we do have some activities planned for parents and kids who are staying over for the evening. These events will be announced at a later date and are subject to change – weather permitting.

## **What are your plans for disciplining?**

Our criteria for behavior is RESPECT. Respect for the facility, respect for each other and respect for oneself. Children who act out will be put in a supervised "time out" situation. The parent will then be notified at the time they come to pickup their child for the day. Three time outs in one day will result in the child's removal from the camp. At the beginning of camp, we have all the children to sign a RESPECT Poster that will be part of the discipline pact for the week.

## **Are parents/grandparents welcome to participate?**

You know your own child. If you feel your presence would inhibit their enjoyment and participation, we suggest you stay away from the activities. If your child feels more comfortable with you there, then feel free to help out. We can use people to setup lunches/snacks.

## **Are there photos going to be taken?**

There is always a wish to have photos taken of the event for future use (advertising, website, newsletter) and for event memories. We would like to take photos, but if you would prefer that we not include your child, then please let us know. Any photo that we choose to use will be followed up by obtaining a photo release from parent.

# PG KIDS KAMP 2015 FAQs cont...



## Can my child bring a cell phone?

Your child's cell phone will need to remain in their backpack throughout the day. Due to privacy issues phones with cameras built in will not be allowed around the other campers. If you need your child to touch base with you at some point during the day, just let us know the time and we will make sure your child is able to use the phone responsibly away from others and in accordance with PG rules. Our goal is to have electronic free fun!

## Can my child bring a camera?

For obvious privacy reasons we can not allow children to carry a camera with them. Although, there may be times that a child would like to have a photo of his/her project or activities. We understand that photos are a normal part of any summer camp. Encourage your child to ask management or camp personnel to take photos for them that would be in keeping with PG camera use policy.

## Is my child too young or too old for the activities?

Camp personnel are working hard to ensure that there will be plenty of age appropriate activities. We will make sure that your child is engaged and participates on their own level. Everyone will get to have fun.

## What is considered proper etiquette at PG?

As part of our first naturist discussion with the kids we will go over proper nudist etiquette. We will discuss the PG rules and guidelines such as always sitting on a towel or not using a cell phone in certain areas. We will help your child develop a clear understanding of proper nudist etiquette so they will feel right at home.

## PG KIDS KAMP 2015 registration and policies

### How To Register

Download or contact the office for Registration forms 513-385-4189. Camp fees will be collected at that time. Participation is extended first to children of camp members. We can accept only 12 children. First come first serve. Note: lunch is not provided.

### Sign in and Out

Campers may arrive no more than 15 minutes before the published start of camp. It is expected that campers be picked up at the end time of camp each day. If you need to work late and cannot make the established pickup time, you will need to make arrangements with the PG management and camp directors. It is our goal to ensure your child has the opportunity to participate in our camp.

### Medical Forms Liability Release

**Medical forms and Liability Releases** must be completed for each child at time of registration. Your spot will not be reserved until these forms have been handed in.

### Waiting List and Refunds

In the event we receive more than 12 requests, campers will be put on a waiting list. Cancellations will be accepted through June 13th with a refund of 75% of your fees.
